3. Reports by Councillors and other representatives

Councillor M Hicks, the County Councillor, gave a verbal report which included the following topics –

- The County Council's budget balanced without reductions in front line services
- Additional money for road signs replacement, roadside flooding, pavements and footpaths and potholes.
- Devolution in Suffolk provisional deal with Central Government with funding and investment over a period to allow the County Council to do many things but will require a directly elected Leader at the 2023 election
- Conversion of all street lighting to LED
- Delivery of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities services review
- Foxhall Recycling Centre improvements, and success of re-use shop
- Electricity pylons running through Norfolk and Suffolk minimal consultation, and need for further mitigation measures. Local MPs and Councils campaigning for an offshore ringmain system as an alternative to pylons.
